

Traffic Education Spring 2020

Hello,

I am so excited to be teaching Traffic Education this year! I have had a lot of interest in the program which is also very exciting. I am asking that students who are planning to take Traffic education this year turn in the bottom portion of this letter to me with acknowledgement of intent to enroll.

Driver's Ed will be held starting March 30, 2020 and will finish up the last week of school. Class will be held from 6:30-8:00 AM. Students will be expected to be on time and in class every day. There will be a parent meeting that is required for each student to be able to participate in the driver's ed program. At the meeting parents will sign paperwork necessary for enrollment in the class. There will be two parent meetings offered but parents only need to attend one or the other meeting. March 26 at 6:00 PM and March 29 at 4:00PM at the school in RM 206 will be the two options for the mandatory parent meetings.

Due to the high interest in the program, students will be admitted based on age and there will be a 15 participant cap. Students must be age 14 by September 1, 2019 in order to take the course to get their Learners Permit. This cutoff date is not a guarantee that a student will get into the course it is the guideline of who will qualify but the students who are older will have priority.

The course will cost \$250.00 which will consist of over 60 hours of instruction including driving time, classroom time, and driving observation time. Students will take the written drivers test and obtain their Learners license during their time in class and will have the opportunity to have the driving test waived if driver shows appropriate skills in driving.
